Justin Valks, Manager (Assets and Maintenance), NCR, has previously raised this matter with Paul Duck, Manager (Passenger Transport Operations).

And North Coast has previously written and met with this customer several times about the wider Kin Kin Road issues (MC118704, MC116840 attached).

As a bit of background, Kin Kin Road is the primary haulage route for dog and trailers operating from a quarry located on Sheppersons Lane, Kin Kin. Since mid-2020, this has been an ongoing and escalating issue for North Coast Region after the quarry changed ownership and production increased. The local community is very vocal about their various safety concerns about the number of heavy vehicles and the road not being wide enough to accommodate trucks and other vehicles, including school buses. There have been calls from the community for TMR to close or relocate the quarry, ban heavy vehicles or certain vehicle classes, or significantly reduce the number of trucks allowed to use Kin Kin Road. However, the quarry is an established business operating under a development approval (DA) issued by Noosa Council. TMR has no authority to retrospectively place conditions on an existing, lawfully operating use through the planning system.

As Justin Valks has been attending regular meetings with QPS, Noosa Council, Sandy Bolton MP and other stakeholders about Kin Kin Road, we feel it best if NCR remains the key point of contact for Kin Kin issues.



I also refer to my previous response to you of 28 October 2020, which provides information from the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) about Kin Kin Road and matters relating to the local quarry.

I am advised that on 5 March 2021, you and other representatives of Save Noosa Hinterland met with Mr Scott Whitaker, Regional Director (North Coast), and Mr Justin Valks, Manager (Assets and Maintenance), North Coast, TMR, and travelled along Kin Kin Road together. I understand that during this time, both parties had the opportunity to discuss some of the concerns and challenges around this issue.

TMR is working with Noosa Council, Ms Sandy Bolton MP, Member for Noosa, the Queensland Police Service, and other stakeholders to discuss community concerns and coordinated approaches for the management of Kin Kin Road. The speed limit on several sections of Kin Kin Road has been reduced to slow traffic and improve safety for all motorists. TMR remains committed to its responsibility to maintain Kin Kin Road, as part of the state-controlled network, in a serviceable condition for road users. TMR is investigating potential future improvements for the road, however, there are no plans or funding allocated for a significant upgrade to Kin Kin Road at this time.

The issues around the quarry's operations, including its suitability for the area, its impacts, the volume of heavy verticles and haulage routes, are matters between Noosa Council and the operators of the quarry. TMR understands that Noosa Council is currently looking into these matters. I have therefore forwarded a copy of your correspondence to council for its consideration.

Thank you for your correspondence to the Honourable Mark Bailey MP, Minister for Transport and Main Roads, about heavy vehicles on Pomona-Kin Kin Road (Kin Kin Road) between Pomona and Kin Kin.

As the state election is scheduled for 31 October 2020, the Queensland Government is now in a caretaker period and I have been requested to reply to you.

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) acknowledges the local community's valid concerns about the impacts of an increase in heavy vehicle movements along Kin Kin Road and would like to assure you that TMR is progressing appropriate actions regarding Kin Kin Road as quickly as possible.

In an immediate response, TMR's maintenance contractor has increased maintenance activity on Kin Kin Road. Immediate works have included a program of larger pavement repairs, vegetation maintenance to reduce potential roadside hazards, and drainage works along the road which will help reduce the risk of future pavement damage. TMR also placed temporary speed reduction signage along parts of Kin Kin Road, while maintenance was underway, and installed temporary traffic counters to collect data on vehicle numbers, speed and classifications. Recently, TMR reduced the permanent speed limit on Kin Kin Road between the range section and Kin Kin from 80km/h limit to 70km/h. This change has been considered and endorsed by the Speed Management Committee, which includes representatives from the Queensland Police Service (QPS), Noosa Shire Council (NSC) and TMR. TMR will continue to consider speed limits along the road to determine if further changes are needed.

In addition, TMR is starting preparations on a program of work to strengthen road edges and shoulders where significant edge damage is occurring. It is expected that these works will commence by the end of 2020, weather conditions and scheduling permitting.

I can advise that the quarry site at Kin Kin is a historical local government development approval. TMR was not a referral agency for the original application for the quarry operation and has no authority to retrospectively place conditions on an existing approved development application.

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Under the Quarry Management Plan, TMR understands that the quarry has invoked certain protocols and a 'Drivers' Code' which includes seeking to minimise truck movements during times when school buses are travelling on the steep and winding section through the Kin Kin range, and reduced speed and increased care to be taken by drivers. Any concerns about quarry drivers not adhering to this 'Drivers' Code' should be raised with the quarry and NSC directly. Additionally, I can advise that TMR has met with NSC and QPS to discuss coordinated approaches for the management of Kin Kin Road, and as a result, TMR transport inspectors and QPS will work together on enforcement/vehicle compliance activities on the road. A further meeting between TMR, NSC, QPS and quarry representatives has recently occurred and TMR will continue to work with these agencies on relevant matters related to Kin Kin Road as needed.

Any general concerns about breaches of the road rules or dangerous driving should be referred to the QPS. Incidents can be reported to the local police station, to Policelink by calling 131 444, or by email to policelink@police.qld.gov.au. QPS has a traffic complaints system that helps in the reporting and management of road safety related complaints made by members of the community.

Regarding potential alternative routes for quarry vehicles, TMR understands that the Quarry Management Plan nominates Kin Kin Road as the primary route for heavy vehicles drivers travelling to and from the quarry. Dr Pages Road, which falls under the jurisdiction of NSC, is also an approved route for quarry vehicles hauling products to certain areas within Noosa, as specified in the Quarry Management Plan. TMR would recommend submitting any enquiries about the use of alternative routes on the local road network or other matters related to the Quarry Management Plan to NSC directly.

TMR advises that general access vehicles (including truck and dog trailer combinations) are allowed to use all Queensland roads. TMR has not approved any vehicles above general access limits for Kin Kin Road. Unfortunately, placing load restrictions on general access vehicles on Kin Kin Road may have a negative impact on important community services, local businesses and residents, and may result in increased volumes of heavy vehicles as loads may need to be separated.

TMR appreciates this is a challenging issue and understands that Kin Kin Road is an important link for the Noosa Hinterland communities. Heavy vehicle/quarry transport is also vital for construction projects and other services at a time when the construction industry and maintaining jobs has never been more critical. TMR understands that driving around heavy vehicles, especially on narrow sections of road can be intimidating, and extra caution is needed. TMR encourages all road users to share the road network safely and drive to the conditions.

TMR is committed to maintaining the road in a safe condition. Motorists are encouraged to call 13 19 40 to report any road incidents, hazards or potholes impacting traffic and requiring urgent attention.

Thank you for your emails of 20 and 24 May 2021 to the Honourable Mark Bailey MP, Minister for Transport and Main Roads, on behalf of NR about school buses and heavy vehicles on Kin Kin Road. The Minister has asked that I respond on his behalf.

As previously advised in correspondence to you of 28 October 2020 and 29 March 2021 from Mr Les Dunn, General Manager (Program Delivery and Operations), Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR), the quarry site at Kin Kin operates under a local government development approval, and TMR has no authority to retrospectively place conditions on an existing approved development application.

Under the Quarry Management Plan (QMP) approved by Noosa Council, we understand the quarry has invoked certain protocols and a 'Drivers' Code' which includes avoiding cartage during times when the school bus is using the local road system, and reduced speed and increased care to be taken by drivers on the steep and winding section through the Kin Kin range. Any concerns you have about breaches of the QMP should be raised directly with Noosa Council and the operators of the quarry.

TMR will continue to work collaboratively with Noosa Council, Ms Sandy Bolton MP, the Queensland Police Service and other stakeholders to discuss community concerns and coordinated approaches for the management of Kin Kin Road, noting the very limited capacity of the Queensland Government and its agencies to have any real impact considering the operation of the quarry in line with the local government development approval.

While TMR understands the concerns you have raised regarding school buses sharing the road with heavy vehicles, we can advise.......

As you are aware, general access vehicles (including truck and dog trailer combinations used by the quarry) can use all Queensland roads. TMR has not approved any vehicles above general access limits for Kin Kin Road. TMR Transport Inspectors conduct regular operations in the area with a focus on truck and dog combinations, and their mass and vehicle safety. The most recent operation was held at the Pemora showgrounds on 12 April 2021 where Transport Inspectors conducted detailed safety inspections of heavy vehicles with a mobile vehicle inspection unit.

TMR appreciates this is a challenging issue and understands that Kin Kin Road is an important link for the Nocsa Hinterland communities. TMR understands that sharing the road with heavy vehicles, especially on narrow sections of road can be intimidating, and extra caution is needed.

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School Safety Department update

- I have raised community concerns in discussions with TMR colleagues in Road Safety and TransLink
- TransLink is involved in administration of school bus services
 - School bus operators are responsible for determining safe locations to stop and to turn around
 - Translink have previously been in touch with the school bus operators who haven't raised any specific concerns
 - TransLink following up on recent issue raised by NR ast week
- TMR has Road Safety Advisors within our Customer Services Branch
 - The Senior Road Safety Advisor contacted the Principal at Cooran State School and discussed concerns about the Bridge Street pedestrian refuge
 - Subsequently the Road Safety Advisor met on site with a representative with Translink and observed a number of safety risks
 - Approx. 40 students crossed at the Bridge St pedestrian refuge.
 - Visibility for the refuge was not great from the west east approach.
 - Traffic was observed exceeding the speed limit heading into Cooran.
 - Parents were parked waiting in cars in the recreation area waiting for students.
 - Buses could not enter the recreation area due to parked cars.
 - Students exiting buses were observed crossing the railway line on the side without pedestrian connectivity.
 - TransLink considering alternative bus stop location on other side of railway line
 - Road Safety advisor contacted Scott Morgan from Noosa Council about options for upgrading the existing pedestrian refuge
 - The advisor also contacted Cooran school about actions taken to-date, and provided the school with pedestrian and cycling safety information

I attend the Kin Kin Roundtable Meeting on a regular basis. The meeting attendees include representatives from Noosa Council, TMR, QPS, Sandy Bolton MP and various community groups. The meeting has arisen from strong community concern about the increase in heavy vehicle operations along Kin Kin Road related to the quarry operations at Sheppersons Lane.

Last Friday, Scott Whitaker (Regional Director) and I met with four representatives from the Save Noosa Hinterland group for a road tour along Kin Kin Road. They raised various issues about road safety matters, including issues relating to quarry vehicle interactions with school-related activities. These include safe school bus travel, the safety of children walking along the road verges to and from the rural school bus stops, school pedestrian activity in the township of Pomona, and safety of motorists using Kin Kin Road for school drop-off and pick-up trips.

They requested I provide contact details of appropriate persons within TMR that may be able to assist and provide advice on these matters. They have followed up on this request in the attached email. 

I attend the Kin Kin Roundtable Meeting on a regular basis. The meeting attendees include representatives from Noosa Council, TMR, QPS, Sandy Bolton MP and various community groups. The meeting has arisen from strong community concern about the increase in heavy vehicle operations along Kin Kin Road related to the quarry operations at Sheppersons Lane.

Last Friday, Scott Whitaker (Regional Director) and I met with four representatives from the Save Noosa Hinterland group for a road tour along Kin Kin Road. They raised various issues about road safety matters, including issues relating to quarry vehicle interactions with school-related activities. These include safe school bus travel, the safety of children walking along the road verges to and from the rural school bus stops, school pedestrian activity in the township of Pomona, and safety of motorists using Kin Kin Road for school drop-off and pick-up trips.

They requested I provide contact details of appropriate persons within TMR that may be able to assist and provide advice on these matters. They have followed up on this request in the attached email. 

I recognise that this has taken slightly longer than expected, so apologies for that. In response to your request we have prepared an image (below) that represents the linear length of 141 Kin Kin Road and a number of metrics that may be used to identify locations of highest risk:

- 1. The top graph represents the ANRAM FSI value at each 100m interval (summarised as ANRAM FSI/km for a standard unit rate purpose). This graph includes three thresholds at the Top 5% (red), Top 10% (green) and Top 15% (yellow) levels. These threshold levels represent the top 5%, 10% and 15% ANRAM FSI/km values of the state-controlled road by length.
- 2. The middle graph represents the location of the fatal and serious injury crashes over the past five years;
- 3. The bottom graph represents the locations along 141 Kin Kin Road that have been identified as Emerging Crash Locations (ECLs). ECLs is an interpretive modelling system/report that identifies road segments and intersections on the state controlled road network that may have recently increased in crash risk. The system achieves this by comparing crash data over various time periods (current year vs. previous year, current year vs. previous 5 year average, last 3 year average vs. previous 3 year average) for a number of performance indicators (social crash cost, number of crashes, number of FSI crashes, number of fatalities and percent FSI crashes per total crashes).


It should be noted that these analytical methods do not account for factors which may or may not affect the level of risk present on the network (i.e., changes over time, road user behaviour etc). As such, I provide these different methods of assessment for Kin Kin Road for your determination of where the locations of greatest risks occur in conjunction with your known knowledge of the location and condition of the corridor.





Sorry for the delay this took longer than anticipated to work out how to present. As discussed, we can provide the ANRAM dataset for Kin Kin Road, however, without context it might not provide an accurate depiction of the corridor. Below we've tried to summarise the ANRAM data for Kin Kin Road.

- Kin Kin Road (141) is 54.5 km long and has an ANRAM FSI risk value of 14
- When ranked in terms of FSI/km it is #316 of 614, so more or less at the median.
- 70% of network road length has ANRAM FSI/km score lower than Kin Kin Road (141), i.e., 30% of network road length has ANRAM FSI/km score greater than Kin Kin Road (141).
- Those 70% of roads account for just 15% of absolute ANRAM FSI values. So 85% of total ANRAM FSI risk is carried on the 30% of the road network that has a higher per km risk than Kin Kin Road (141).

In the graph below, which looks at total road lengths and not parts of roads, the steeper the curve, the higher the ANRAM FSI risk per km for the road length. Kin Kin Road is represented by the label.

Based on this analysis Kin Kin Road (141) as a whole is not intuitively classifiable as 'high risk': however there would likely be sections of the road where localised risk is elevated. Do we need to drill down further?





Completed investigations/actions following the meeting

- Ms Bolton requested a map showing the sections where TMR has started early design
 investigations for road improvements (two priority sections, totalling three kilometres,
 between the southern foot of the Kin Kin range and Kin Kin township). Ms Bolton would
 like to present this at an upcoming community meeting. The map is at Attachment 1.
- TMR advised it would conduct an Australian National Risk Assessment Model (ANRAM) assessment of Kin Kin Road.
 - TMR's Engineering and Technology Branch has conducted an ANRAM assessment of Kin Kin Road. Preliminary high-level findings from the assessment include:
 - when ranked in terms of FSI (fatal and severe injury crashes) per kilometre, it is number 316 of 614 state-controlled roads (which is around the median when compared to all state-controlled roads)
 - based on this preliminary ANRAM analysis, Kin Kin Road as a whole route is not classified/considered as 'high risk'



- Ms Bolton requested that TMR investigate school zones on the quarry haulage route (including in Kin Kin, Cooran and Pomona townships) and whether there are existing flashing school zone signs.
 - TMR has installed and continues to monitor and maintain flashing school zone signs at two of the three schools located in the communities of Kin Kin, Cooran and Pomona:
 - Main Street outside Kin Kin State School has a 40km/h school zone and flashing school zone signs (installed in 2014).
 - James Street outside Cooran State School has a 40km/n school zone and flashing school zone signs (installed in 2020).
 - Station Street outside Pomona State School has a 40km/h school zone. Station Street is a cul-de-sac and does not have or require flashing school zone signs. Pomona State School has a supervised school crossing, which is located across Station Street.
- Ms Bolton requested that TMR look into providing heavy vehicle advisory signage on Kin Kin Road.
 - TMR will provide images of options for potential/additional 'heavy vehicle awareness' signage to be installed along Kin Kin Road to Noosa Council and Ms Bolton for their feedback.
