Summary: JF advised NR of the TMR process involved in renaming of a bridge and recommended the next step in this process.

Stakeholder Comments: NR said she would write a letter recommending the renaming of Jingi Jingi Creek bridge to Vellnagel Bridge based on the extensive Chinchilla community involvement of the Vellnagel family over several generations.

She said she realised the process could take some time but that she was keen to push the idea and 'give it her best shot'.

She said she would try to muster other community support for the idea and would include that in a supporting letter after an initial letter advocating the idea had been sent to TMR.

NR said she would send the letter to JF at TMR Toowoomba office.

Team Response: JF advised NR of the extensive process involved in renaming bridges, with the Minister being responsible for the final approval.

JF recommended NR seek other signatures of support from community members to strengthen her submission. She suggested NR initially write a letter recommending the name change with the history of the Vellnagel family community involvement attached. In the meantime she could muster up support from other community members for a letter of support to be sent after the initial letter.

Background

- A \$29 million project to replace the existing culverts and rehabilitate the road at Jingi Jingi Creek on the Warrego Highway commenced in July 2016 as part of WHUP. This project is due for completion in July 2017.
- On 29 June 2017 correspondence was received by TMR proposing the naming of this new bridge, outlining the contribution of the Vellnagel family to this region and community (**Attachment 1**).
- The proposal is for the bridge to be named the "Vellnagel Bridge".
- The bridge is located approximately 53 kilometres west of Dalby and 12 kilometres East of Chinchilla, as per attached map (**Attachment 2**).

Key Issues

- The Vellnagel family has strong ties to the Chinchilla community through former Chinchilla Shire Councillor, Mr Albert Vellnagel (1952 – 1967), and his son Mr Graham Vellnagel, who was also a Councillor (1985 – 1997) and Deputy Mayor, in addition to his often voluntary involvement in many local and state committees and service clubs.
- The property the Vellnagel family owned is in very close proximity to Jingi Jingi Creek.
- There is precedence for this request as another bridge in the area has been named the "George Gray Bridge" after a Chinchilla Shire Councillor.

Better bridge to boost Warrego Highway

- **New bridge over Jingi Jingi Creek west of Dalby to improve transport efficiency and productivity**
- **Works form part of the broader Warrego Highway Upgrade Programme to improve safety and efficiency along one of Australia's key freight routes**

Road safety and flood immunity on the Warrego Highway has been improved following the completion of a new bridge over Jingi Jingi Creek, around 53 kilometres west of Dalby.

Federal Infrastructure and Transport Minister Darren Chester said the new concrete bridge would substantially improve the safety and reliability of the busy freight corridor.

"The expansion of the region's mining and agricultural industries has led to a growing number of heavy vehicles on this section of the Warrego Highway. Replacing this bridge will help keep the region's economy and jobs base growing, which is great news for local communities and businesses," Mr Chester said.

Acting Queensland Minister for Main Roads and Road Safety Steven Miles said the safety improvements provided a more reliable route for vehicles travelling along the highway.

"Despite delays caused by weather events in March, the project was completed under budget. The Warrego Highway upgrades are providing direct employment, economic and regional development benefits, with an average of 84 direct jobs supported during the life of the Jingi Jingi bridge project," Mr Miles said.

Federal Member for Maranoa David Littleproud said the upgrade involved a number of improvements.

"The approaches to the bridge were widened to about 11 metres, the bridge was raised and deteriorated culverts were replaced. The Australian Government contributed \$25.8 million towards the \$32.3 million project, which forms part of the broader Warrego Highway Upgrade Program being delivered in partnership with the Queensland Government," Mr Littleproud said.

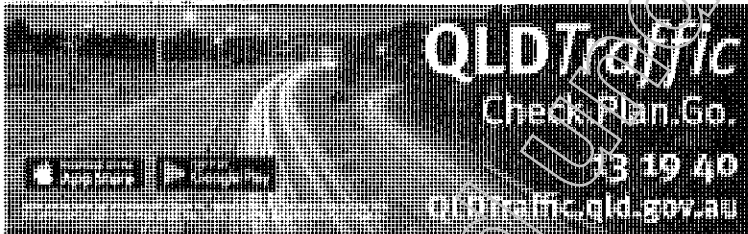

POLICY AND PROCEDURES FOR BRIDGE NAMING

GENERAL

It is important to ensure that bridge naming proposals are appropriate and likely to be generally acceptable to the local community. To this end, consultation must be appropriate and include input from relevant sources including Local Members of Parliament, Local Government, progress associations, industry bodies and peak community groups.

TRIGGERS FOR PROCESS

- The District Director receives a request for a bridge naming from local government, local organisations such as Rotary or Lions, members of the local community or a Member of Parliament.
- NOTE - at this point, no consultation with the community by Main Roads is to occur.

ACTION *(there are 2 steps in this process)*

Step 1

- The District Director prepares a submission to the Director-General (through the Regional Executive Director and Deputy Director-General).
- The submission is to include:
 1. source of request (including supporting documentation)
 2. background/history of nomination
 3. appropriateness of nomination including anticipated reaction from community
 4. consultation process considered appropriate
 5. map showing the location of the bridge
- Following consideration by the Director-General, including consultation with the Minister if necessary, advice of approval/rejection of the proposed bridge name and/or scope of consultation is conveyed to the District Director, with copies to the Deputy Director-General and Regional Executive Director.

Step 2

- On receipt of the Director-General's advice, the District Director proceeds as per decision ie (a) carries out appropriate consultation (as recommended) or
(b) advises person/organisation who/which forwarded proposal that Main Roads does not wish to proceed with the proposal.
- On completion of appropriate consultation, the District Director provides a recommendation to the Director-General (through the Regional Executive Director and Deputy Director-General) for approval by the Minister.

- The submission is to include:
 - copy of the original submission material
 - summary of consultation outcomes
 - draft letter of advice from the Minister to the organisation/person making the proposal
 - draft letters of advice from the Minister to the next of kin (where appropriate)
 - draft media statement
 - recommendation that the bridge naming be publicised either as an official bridge naming event (eg. as part of an official road opening or commissioning) or through issuing a media statement only.
- Decision by the Minister on the bridge naming is to be conveyed by the Director-General, to the District Director for necessary action, with copies to the Deputy Director-General and Regional Executive Director.
- If the bridge naming proposal is rejected, the District Director advises the person/organisation who/which forwarded the nomination, that Main Roads does not wish to proceed with the proposal. If the proposal is accepted, the Minister advises the person/organisation or the next of kin (where appropriate).
